Salary range, based upon the current labor agreement, is \$27.23/hour to \$36.02/hour. Salary dependent on qualifications. All uniforms and equipment are provided upon appointment to the Department.

## **Qualifications:**

Minimum requirements are: must be a U.S. Citizen; must be at least 21 years of age; must possess a valid driver's license; must possess a minimum of 60 credits from an approved university, college, or technical school; must have no felony or domestic violence convictions and be able to possess a firearm; must be eligible for Wisconsin Law Enforcement Standards Board certification.

Furthermore, he or she will possess good verbal and written communication skills, strong problem solving skills, sound judgement, the ability to react quickly and effectively in stressful situations, the ability to perform all essential functions of the position, and the ability to use all standard law enforcement equipment.
